In 2004, the third annual event raised approximately **\$42,000** making it our most successful fundraiser to date. The money is dedicated for use during the school year in which it was raised so current students benefit from the donations.



In addition to raising money for the school, the Phone-a-thon is also a community building event. Over the course of two evenings, more than eighty parents, alumni and staff volunteers come together in the cafeteria and attempt to contact every Bearden High School family. As volunteers make calls, Bearden families are given a chance to ask questions and make suggestions concerning their student's school experience.

Girls State is a hands-on experience of practical applications of Americanism and good citizenship. The program is a non-partisan attempt to teach and instill in young Tennessee women a love of God and country. Girls State is a strenuous program that requires a delegate to be energetic, in good health, have a positive attitude, be able to adjust to unfamiliar situations and be willing to accept the challenge of new experiences. Girls State is held at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro, Tennessee, during the last week of May. The faculty selected the following girls as this year's delegates: **Paige Harmony, Kaitlin Wojnar, Katie Sanders, and Emily Larson.**

Boys State is a practical experience for young men to view actual problems of government as it operates in Tennessee. Participants are assigned to mythical cities for the week. The goal of this program is to impress upon future generations the responsibilities of citizenship, to develop leadership and bring young men to a full realization of the duties of American citizens. ## Feld Family Scholarship



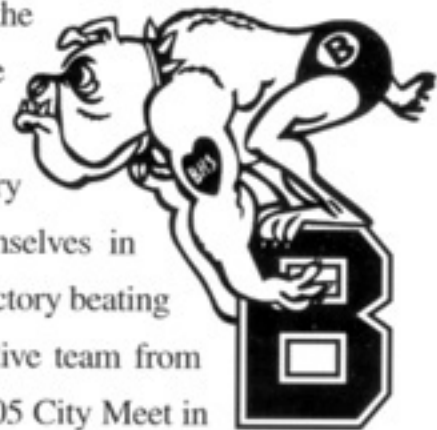

The Bearden High School Swim and Dive Team would like to thank the Foundation for the money they generously gave towards the Tennessee State Championship Rings for state qualifying swim and dive athletes. The BHS Swim and Dive Team finished first in Nashville, at the state meet in February of 2005, surpassing unbelievable odds. The Aquadoggs surprised themselves in dominating over ALL the public AND private teams; it was a phenomenal victory beating the other 120 teams represented. Not only was this the first swim and dive team from Bearden High School to ever win the State Meet, the team also won the 2005 City Meet in Knoxville for the first time in the school's history; incredible back to back championships.
